RISE AGAIN STRONGER: THE STORY OF ASH

Imagine a helpless, injured dog running in the street with matted, dirty fur, covered in ticks, nails overgrown into her paws, and red, bulging eyes as a result of blunt force head trauma. This is the condition Ash was found in by her new Mom. Ash was unchipped, had no collar or tags, and was not spayed. Terrified and shaking, Ash was immediately attached to her Mom's side for safety and comfort, and that is exactly what she found.



Slowly but surely, Ash's Mom began addressing her dog's issues. After a bath and grooming, her Mom contacted SNAP to qualify for a voucher to get her spayed. It was soon discovered that Ash had cysts on her belly that needed to be removed. Disabled and on a fixed income, Ash's Mom was unable to financially cover the costs of surgery. Our friends at SNAP advised her to contact the Doña Ana County Humane Society regarding the Animal Relief Fund.

The Animal Relief Fund allows for financially under-resourced pet parents to apply for vouchers to help cover the cost of vaccinations, medical care, and long-term prescription medications for their pets. Ash's Mom was able to qualify for medical vouchers to help pay for the cyst removal and Ash is recovering quickly! "Ash is a doll! She is a beautiful dog, she's my mamacita," gushed Ash's Mom.

When she was asked what having access to a program like the Animal Relief Fund meant to her, Ash's Mom said "I am extremely grateful! I will tell anybody to donate and support these programs because they are so needed in this community. Being on a fixed income, you can't add extra bills. I would've had to choose between leaving her that way or getting her the help she needed." Luckily, thanks to our friends and supporters, Ash's Mom didn't have to make that choice.

DACHS RUFF TO READY TRAINER EARNS PROFESSIONAL DOG TRAINER CERTIFICATION

Put your hands–and paws–together in a round of applause for the Doña Ana County Humane Society's Ruff to Ready trainer, Hope Movsesian, on her professional certification by the Certification Council for Professional Dog Trainers (CCPDT).

The CPDT-KA® certification recognizes the knowledge and experience of professional dog trainers. Certificants must provide references that attest to their work and pass a rigorous written exam that focuses on the science behind dog behavior and the application of training techniques. CPDT-KA® certification provides an independent, scientifically valid measure of an individual's understanding of the field of dog training, including instruction skills, learning theory, ethology, equipment, and animal husbandry.

The certification will allow Hope to provide resources to better serve our Ruff to Ready clients. When asked how the certification



will impact her work, Hope said "The certification is a tremendous accomplishment and partnered with my annual CEU goals, will allow me to keep up to date on techniques that I will be able to share with our Ruff to Ready clients."

The Ruff to Ready program provides training for dogs recently adopted or being fostered from the Animal Services Center of the Mesilla Valley or ACTion Programs for Animals. Pet parents are able to qualify for up to two complimentary training sessions. Ruff to Ready training can help pets adjust to their new homes and provide training, advice, and guidance to help set pets up for success and stop them from being returned to shelters and adoption centers.
